- Practical catechetical implications are highlighted in each session.
- 4 elective modules focus on catechetical accompaniment as outlined in the 2020 Directory for Catechesis.
- The student's learning is assessed for each module through a 10minute conversation with a tutor.

COMPREHENSIVE

- 8 modules of comprehensive formation for all forms of catechesis.

In its 8 modules, the Certificate covers the foundational truths of the Catholic Faith and how to transmit them in catechesis.

It follows the structure of the Catechism of the Catholic Church in its 4 dimensions: doctrinal, liturgical, moral, and spiritual.

The Certificate aims to equip new and experienced catechists to be teachers of the faith (Modules 1-4), witnesses of faith (Modules 5-6), and accompaniers in faith (Modules 7-8).
